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The marriage of the Lamb is come, and His wife has made herself ready.

We have waited for Him, He will save us.

Your loins girded, your lamps burning, looking for the Master.

International Convocation The General Assembly of the Saints Bethel, Pennsylvania, U.S.A.

During a very tense period in our world, with two major wars showing marked signs of escalation, Yahweh, our Heavenly Father, provided the opportunity for His people to gather at the International Headquarters of the Assemblies of Yahweh at Bethel, Pennsylvania, to observe the 2024 Feast of Tabernacles.

On the day preceding the be-

ginning of the Holy Convocation, brethren, sisters, children, and dedicated visitors from many locations within the United States and abroad converged at the Assemblies of Yahweh. The members of the Assembly, working as a wellcoordinated team, transformed the feast grounds into a most picturesque site. Temporary dwellings, consisting of camper trailers and tents of all shapes and sizes, were neatly laid out around the Assemblies of Yahweh Convocation Center. Inside the tabernacle, brethren and sisters decorated the meeting hall. Consequently, branches of palm trees and boughs of trees were strategically placed within the meeting hall. In front the podium, colorful fruits and flowers were blended into a glori-



ous display. Behind the platform, the chosen banner for the 2024 Feast of Tabernacles was placed. At the top of the banner, in the farthest background, a golden sunset and the Names of Yahweh and His Son Yahshua hovered over the Holy City Jerusalem. In the foreground, a flock of sheep grazed on the tender grass in front of rows of olive trees. In the center of the banner, the theme for the 2024 Feast proclaimed in bold white letters: **The Midnight Cry–Behold, the Bridegroom!**

By the end of the 14th day of the seventh scriptural month of Ethanim, before sundown, all things were ready for the muchanticipated Feast to begin. Yahweh had provided the perfect weather for everyone to complete all of the necessary preparations, and the day began with a spectacular sunset over the unified camp of the spiritual Israel of Yahweh.

Day One-First High Day

Just before 7:00 p.m., the ushers warmly greeted the visitors as we all settled into the meeting hall for the beginning of the Feast of Tabernacles. Teaching Elder Jonathan S. Meyer was the moderator for the evening's service. Elder Jonathan extended a welcome to all of the members who had traveled from near and far. He noted that there was an increase in the number of members who had traveled to Bethel from foreign countries. These included members from Canada, the United Kingdom, and at least three islands of the Caribbean. It was evident that the united congregation was ready to rejoice before Almighty Yahweh, having overcome a most challenging year. The congregation blended their voices, with joy in their hearts, to offer songs of praises to the great Name of Yahweh through His Son, Yahshua the Messiah.

The devotional reading and prayer for the evening was given

by Graduate Obadiah Edouard Angol. Psalm 122 was selected for the devotional, and we were reminded that we should always "pray for the peace of Jerusalem."

For the announcements, Teaching Elder Jonathan Meyer briefly discussed the significance of the selected banner for the Feast, that was also printed on the front cover of the Feast Brochure. A copy of the Feast Brochure was given to all registered members and families. The rules and policies governing all activities at the Feast, as well as the schedule of responsibilities, were all clearly outlined in this document.

The keynote sermon for the evening was a pre-recorded message by Directing Elder Jacob O. Meyer (OBM). The theme was about love among the brethren. The love chapter—1 Corinthians 13—was used as a pilot passage from the Sacred Scriptures. We were reminded of the Greek word agape: an outflowing concern for all people. Elder Meyer also instructed us to strive always to live a life that is reflective of the Philadelphia Assembly of Revelation 3:7-13. Yahweh loved us through self-sacrifice; we must not bear grudges and be determined to hold on to the key of David—the Beloved.

The first evening service closed on a very high note as the members returned to their temporary dwellings with a full moon providing light over the campsite.

After a peaceful night's rest, we gathered again for the morning worship service at 10:00 a.m. Deacon Robert Lucas was the moderator for this service, and Senior Missionary Glenn Roberts brought the devotions. Psalm 100 encouraged us to praise Yahweh with singing and music. All of the congregational songs rendered to Yahweh were ably accompanied by both piano and organ.

The offering sermonette for the

morning was presented by the Local Leader of the Canadian Assembly, Senior Missionary Taddy Clarke. The message was titled, "Be a Cheerful Giver." We were reminded of the importance of being totally dedicated to our Father Yahweh, glorifying and honoring Him with our substance. Like obedient children, we were encouraged to give joyfully when we come before Yahweh on these commanded days. In addition, he explained, very clearly, the significance of the three scriptural tithes—first tithe, second tithe, and the third tithe. The sermonette ended with 2 Corinthians 9:6-7, beckoning us to give our offerings bountifully and cheerfully to Almighty Yahweh.

After the collection of the offerings, Teaching Elder Jonathan S. Meyer came forward and offered a prayer, which was then followed by some announcements. It was at this point that he *blew the shofar* to signal the First High Day of the 2024 Feast of Tabernacles!

The main sermon for the morning was preached by Teaching Elder Jonathan S. Meyer. In keeping with the selected theme for the Feast, the title was: "Behold the Bridegroom." Matthew 25:1-13 was referenced throughout the message. We were instructed to model the five wise virgins, to be always prepared for Yahshua's return by having oil (Yahweh's Name) for our lamps (keeping Torah) and be always watchful, for we know not the day, nor the hour, when Yahshua will come. We were also reminded of the importance of having the proper wedding garments as a bride betrothed to a husband (Revelation 19:6-8 and 16:15). Elder Jonathan raised the question: "Will you help to build the Assemblies of Yahweh, or will you tear it down?" He reviewed our Confession of Faith and closed the sermon with Hebrews 12:1-2—look to Yahshua!

After lunch, we gathered again for the afternoon worship service. Graduate Obadiah Wesley Hanks was the moderator, and Senior Missionary Walter Jernigan was called forward to offer the devotional Psalm and prayer. The first afternoon's message was presented by Graduate Obadiah Edouard Angol, with the title, "The Kingdom of Yahweh." He raised some pertinent questions in the sermon: Are we prepared for the Kingdom? Are we retaining the messages heard? What will Yahshua say to you when He comes?

Deacon Nathaniel A. Meyer preached the second afternoon's message. It was titled, "The Love of the Brethren." We were taught to be tenderly affectionate (with empathy), to be zealous, to stand up for love, to have doctrinal unity, and to strive always to increase our spirituality. A very interesting point that was shared is that we, the members of the Assemblies of Yahweh, should strive to be *sukkah*, which has a Hebrew root meaning *to be entwined*.

After the closure of the afternoon's worship service, the Rabbi's *tisch* followed. The entire congregation was given the opportunity to personally greet Head Deaconess Ruth Meyer, Teaching Elder Jonathan S. Meyer, Deacon Nathaniel A. Meyer, and Graduate Obadiah Mary Meyer. We were all treated with tasty fruit and natural apple cider.

Day Two

The second day of the 2024 Feast of Tabernacles began with an open evening, during which some brethren and sisters found time to fellowship with each other, while others spent quiet time resting and meditating.

The morning of this day was bright and sunny with very clear skies, and we gathered for worship at 10:00 a.m. The moderator was Senior Missionary Robert Peters, and Senior Missionary







Johnie C. Stegall led us in devotions. There were two mini-sermons preached on this morning. The first was by Graduate Obadiah Scott Jernigan. The message was named "This Little Light of Mine." Mark 10:1-18 was used to introduce his message. In the mini-sermon, he highlighted that we ought to be humble, like children, in order

to be saved, and we should follow Yahshua, our light, as we shine our lights to the world. The message was closed in an unusual manner, which turned out to be a very strong inspiration for all in attendance. Graduate Obadiah Scott Jernigan invited the children and youth of the Assemblies of Yahweh, and whoever was willing to come forward, to sing with joy and gestures the song titled: *"This Little Light of Mine."* We were all touched in our hearts and minds by the rendition.

The second mini-sermon was brought to us by Deacon Robert Lucas. He titled the message "Loving Yahweh with all Your Heart, Mind, and Soul-Keep Your Focus!" Deacon Lucas prefaced the sermon with Matthew 13:1-23—The Parable of the Four Soils— and pointed us to nurture the seed that was sown in us, striving always to grow spiritually and bring forth good fruits. He further reminded us that love must be implanted in us and not just spoken. We should let go of the negative past and subject ourselves to Yahweh, while always resisting the Devil. Deacon Lucas ended the mini-sermon with Proverbs 13:6: "Righteousness shall be our guard."

The afternoon of the second day of the Feast was an open period, which was utilized mainly to prepare for the weekly Sabbath which was quickly approaching.

Third Day— The weekly Sabbath

Just after sunset, at the beginning of the third day of the Feast, Teaching Elder Jonathan S. Meyer guided the congregation into the designated readings and praver for opening of the weekly Sabbath. Senior Missionary Jacob Z. Meyer then took on the responsibility of moderating the services for the evening. Psalm 32 was selected by Senior Missionary Danny Duke who gave the devotions that evening. The rest of the evening was devoted to the reading of the Megillah. Brethren took turns reading through the 12 chapters of the Book of Ecclesiastes.

We all retired to our abodes, seeking a rejuvenation to come together again on Sabbath morning.

On the morning of the Sabbath day, the weather had become hazy with cooler temperatures, and there was a light rain falling over the entire feast grounds. The conditions reminded us of Deuteronomy 32:2: "My doctrine shall drop as the rain, my speech shall distil as the dew: As the small rain on the tender grass, and as the showers on the herb." Consequently, we gathered again to worship our Heavenly Father Yahweh with gladness in our hearts and to hear the strong meat of His Word.

Leading the service on this Sabbath morning was Senior Missionary Taddy Clarke, and the devotional reading and prayer was done by Senior Missionary Ron Anderson.

Deacon Nathaniel A. Meyer delivered the First Message. It was titled, "Vanquishing Apathy with Zeal." Deacon Nathaniel introduced the sermon with Haggai 1:2-6, which describes a "sluggish" people. We were taught that Haggai means festive, from Hag which means Feast. We were, therefore, challenged with the pertinent question: "Are we being fruitful, or are we just surviving? Throughout the rest of the message, the concepts of apathy—lack of interest, or goal-directed activity, was contrasted with zeal—great energy in pursuit of a cause. The message ended with 2 Thessalonians 1:3-5, which implored us to increase in love.

Directing Elder Jacob O. Meyer (OBM) brought the main sermon via a pre-recorded message from 1980. It was titled, "No Prophecy Without Faith." The sermon started with Isaiah 46:9-10, bringing to our minds that "Yahweh is Elohim and there is no one else, declaring the end from the beginning." The emphasis was on the fact that faith is a fundamental element in understanding prophecy. We were enlightened about the meaning of Midian (con*tentious*, *quarrelling*) and that the Midianites were descendants of Abraham. Moab and Ammon were cousins of Israel; yet they fought against them. In the Assemblies of Yahweh, we should avoid the Midianite characteristics, seeking to look at the end from the beginning and striving always to be the carefully selected Gideon's army, who tests the water (doctrines) before drinking it!

Yahweh provided a bright, sunny Sabbath afternoon so that the children were able to join their teachers at different locations around the feast grounds for the first Junior Congregation class. The assigned teachers for these classes were Graduate Obadiahs Wesley Hanks and Scott Jernigan, Deacon Robert Lucas, and Senior Missionary John Dalton.

While the children were studying various topics that were associated with the theme of the Feast, the adult members listened to a pre-recorded Bible Study by Elder Jacob O. Meyer (OBM). The title was: "Seven Rules for Understanding the Bible."

Day Four

At sunset, the fourth day of the Feast started with another open evening. The Qahal Yahweh spent some time fellowshiping with each other, but the weather changed again to rain and some thunderstorms. As a result, most persons retired to their respective temporary dwellings.

Bearing in mind that the Feast of Tabernacles is also called the Feast of Ingathering, and that the major purpose for the pilgrimage is worship and hearing the Word, the entire congregation came together at 10:00 a.m. for morning services. The moderator was Senior Missionary Ulrick Sutherland. Senior Missionary David Thorpe came forward to lead the devotions. Brother Thorpe selected prophetic Psalm 83 and prayed for peace in the Holy Land and in the world. "And they shall know that your Name is Yahweh alone, Most High over all the Earth." (Psalm 83:18).

The first mini-sermon for the morning was preached by Graduate Obadiah Wesley Hanks. The title was "Do Our Witnesses Agree?" Malachi 3 was used as the pilot text and verse 6 was harmonized with Hebrews 13:8 to establish the fact that Yahweh and His Son, Yahshua, are always consistent and do not change—

"the same yesterday and today, and forever." We were counseled to model the three holy men of Daniel chapter 3, and the faithful spies, Yahshua and Caleb, who were always in agreement and faithful to Yahweh. Most significantly, we were reminded to emulate our perfect example, Yahshua Messiah, to strive to do better in conflict resolutions and to convict the gainsayers. The message ended with the question: "Does our witness agree with Yahshua's?" (1 Peter 2:21).

The second mini-sermon was



presented by Deacon Jeffrey Dolph. Deacon Jeff took a different approach into an earlier message with a similar title: "Loving Yahweh with All of Your Heart, Mind, and Soul (2.0)." Psalm 116:1-14 was chosen as his pilot text. The touching Psalm begins; "I love Yahweh " The Shema was reinforced-our natural inclination should be an all-consuming love. Deacon Dolph admonished us to build a bond with Almighty Yahweh which cannot be broken. to love not in word, or with the tongue, but to love in deed and truth. The sermon ended with words of encouragement for the whole congregation to continue to work on being Yahshua's Bride!

The second Bible Study and Junior Congregation was held on the afternoon of the fourth day of the Feast. We listened to a prerecorded Bible Study that was given by Elder Jacob O. Meyer (OBM) on the topic: "Authority in the Assembly." We were pointed to many Scriptures, which instructed us to give honor and respect to those who have the rule over us in the Assembly. We were also taught to treat our brethren and sisters with respect and to honor the elderly (grey hair) in a special way.

Day Five

It was amazing how time flies when one is immersed in committed spiritual engagement! We could not believe that we were now past the halfway mark of the 2024 Feast of Tabernacles ! The beginning of the fifth day was much anticipated by the entire congregation. It was the scheduled **Night** of Special Music! It was the evening when the calves of our lips and music were rendered to Almighty Yahweh through Yahshua Messiah as spiritual sacrifices of praise and thanksgiving. The service was moderated by Music Director and Senior Missionary Barukyah Shaparenko, who also read the devotional Psalm.

There was much variety in the specials that were rendered to Yahweh. There were instrumentals, which were offered in some cases by children, with the piano, organ, cello, and violin being used. Special songs were rendered as solos, duets, trios, family groups, and choirs. We left the Meeting Hall that evening feeling very inspired by the music and songs that were presented as sacrifices, and we looked forward to receiving the recordings to listen to again during the upcoming year and bevond.

At 10:00 a.m., on the fifth day of the Feast, we came together for the Missionary Convocation. This service was moderated by Deacon Nathaniel A. Meyer. Teaching Elder Jonathan S. Meyer brought the devotions. Both Elder Jonathan and Deacon Nathaniel gave updates on the many missionary programs that are currently being employed by the Assemblies of Yahweh. In addition to the numerous radio and television programs that are aired on stations across the United States, Canada, and the Caribbean Islands, the progress of the Assemblies of Yahwehowned Shortwave Radio Station WMLK (the house of outreach)

was highlighted. The feedback received from many countries around the world has confirmed that the penetration of the radio signal has exceeded the originally anticipated target audience. It was also noted that WMLK would soon be broadcasting on three different frequencies that will serve to boost the present spread and airtime of the current programming. There is no doubt that Almighty Yahweh is channelling the outreach of this powerful clean instrument!

Deacon Nathaniel informed the congregation about the new **Mobile Application (App)** that was developed by Senior Missionary Salomon Cajina. This app is presently being tested on both Android and iOS (iPhone) platforms. Many members of the Assemblies of Yahweh have downloaded the testing-version of the app and are providing feedback to the developer.

Using a projector, Brother Cajina demonstrated the features of the Mobile App. We were very thrilled by its capabilities. Most of the Assemblies of Yahweh's present outreach programs are brought together at the fingertips of the end-user of this app. We eagerly anticipate the formal approval of the app, so that it can be added to the learning and outreach toolbox of each member.

At the end of the Missionary Convocation Service, we were all motivated in helping to fulfil the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20).

Following the service, the Senior Missionary Examination was taken by all members who were





willing and had met the qualifications to do so.

The afternoon of this fifth day of the Feast was the family outing and fellowship meal. Quality time was spent by brethren and sisters interacting and enjoying fellowship together. Due to the inclement weather, the children and youth recreations were conducted during open times throughout the Feast.

The day was closed with members enjoying a very delicious fellowship meal together in much tranquillity in a Kingdom-like atmosphere.

The annual Feast of Tabernacles Auction was scheduled for that evening. Members joyfully participated in bidding for the wide range of items that were available for sale. Much-needed funds were generated from this venture and will help towards financing the many programs of the Assembly.

Day Six

The moderator for the morning service was Senior Missionary Craig Allen. Senior Missionary Daniel Clarke selected Psalm 126 for the devotional reading, and he led the congregation in prayer to Yahweh's throne of grace.

The books of the Bible that were selected for reading this year

were Joel, Obadiah, Hosea, and Revelation.

The final Bible Study and Children's Classes were held on the afternoon of the sixth day of the Feast. The adults listened to a pre-recorded Bible Study done by Directing Elder Jacob O. Meyer (OBM) on the subject of "The Spiritual, or Ideal, Family."

Day Seven

The seventh day started with an open evening—some persons enjoyed a hayride around the Assemblies of Yahweh property, while others were engaged in other recreational activities.

In the morning, at 10:00 a.m., we all assembled once again to worship our Heavenly Father Yahweh. This baptismal service was moderated by Senior Missionary Walter Jernigan. Devotions was led by Senior Missionary David Atkins.

The main sermon—"Our Covenant for Life"—was delivered by Teaching Elder Jonathan S. Meyer. It was indeed a powerful message to all who were present, especially the three candidates that were approved for baptism. We were reminded that we should diligently keep all of Yahweh's commandments, looking always to Yahshua, our perfect example (1 Peter 2:21). We were instructed to stop sinning, start obeying, and present our members as servants to righteousness unto sanctification. We have not been made perfect yet, but we should always be pressing on to perfection.

Three individuals confirmed their **Public Confession of Faith** and were baptized into the name of Yahshua in the mikvah that was prepared for that purpose. Everyone welcomed with joy Brothers Romeo Miele and Nathaniel Bubley, and Sister Elizabeth Elkadri as new members of the Assemblies of Yahweh. All three members are now officially a part of the Canadian Assembly.

The afternoon of the last day of the Feast of Tabernacles was open, and members were busy preparing for the highly anticipated Last Great Day.

The Last Great Day

It is on this day, which represents the eternal Kingdom of Yahweh, that members of the Assemblies of Yahweh look forward for many blessings, both individually as well as collectively, for the faithful observance of eight days of sacred worship to Almighty Yahweh through His Son, Yahshua



the Messiah. The day started with an evening worship service which was moderated by Graduate Obadiah Edouard Angol. Senior Missionary Walter Winston came forward and led us in the devotional reading and prayer. Brother Winston selected Psalm 133 and, as we read together, we felt in our hearts "how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!"

The first mini-sermon for the evening was preached by Deacon Jeffrey Dolph. It was titled: "Rejecting Laodiceanism." Deacon Jeff introduced the message with 2 Corinthians 7:1, and urged us: "Beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all defilement of flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of Elohim." The rest of the sermon delved deeply into the Laodicean Assembly, as described in Revelation 3:14-22. We were warned never to appear naked (without righteousness), not to think we are rich (self-righteous attitude), and, at no time, to let our daily routine bring us down. Conversely, we were advised to buy gold (Yahweh's Law), to put on white garments (the righteous acts of the Saints), to keep studying the Bible, and to strive always to counteract complacency (lukewarmness). Deacon Dolph ended the message with Luke 21:28: "But when these things begin to come to pass, look up, and lift up your heads; because your redemption draws near."

The second mini-sermon for the evening was delivered by Deacon Robert Lucas. It was titled, "Keeping Our Garments Unspotted and Unwrinkled—The Characteristics of the Bride-to-Be." In keeping with the theme of the Feast, "Behold the Bridegroom," Deacon Lucas laid the foundation for his message with Revelation 19:7 and Matthew 5:48. "The marriage of the lamb is come, and her wife has made herself ready." "You therefore shall be perfect, as your Heavenly Father is perfect." After establishing that Yahshua is our PERFECT Bridegroom, Deacon Lucas then counselled us to be ever vigilant in preparing ourselves to be in a state of readiness for the marriage of the Lamb. He cited many Scriptures that clearly describe the perfect Bride. The sermon came to a close with John 7:37, "Now on the last day, the great day of the feast, Yahshua stood and cried, saying, If any man thirst, let him come to me and drink." We retired to our booths (temporary dwellings), seeking to be refreshed with a good night's rest on the morning of the Last Great Day.

The Saints of the Yahweh were united once more for worship service at 10:00 a.m. on the Last Great Day of the 2024 Feast of Tabernacles. The moderator for this service was Deacon Jeffrey Dolph and Senior Missionary Jonathan Bailey led us in a devotional Psalm and prayer.

The offering sermonette for the morning was delivered by Senior Missionary Ulrick Sutherland. The title was selected from Psalm 116:12: "What Shall I Render to Yahweh for All His Benefits Toward Me?" Senior Missionary Sutherland used the entire Psalm 116 as a pilot text for the message. He established the fact that we all have been tremendously blessed by Almighty Yahweh, and he encouraged the congregation to give sacrificially of their tithes and freewill offerings to support the work of the ministry in these end times.

The main sermon for the morning was preached by Deacon Nathaniel A. Meyer. It was titled: "The Day of the Great Feast." Revelation 20 and 21:1-2 were used as introductory passages.





The prophetic significance of the Feast of Tabernacles and the Last Great Day was brought to the forefronts of our minds-Resurrection, Millennial Kingdom, and Eternity. After taking us back to Matthew 25—the Parable of the Ten Virgins-Deacon Nathaniel emphasized verses 41 and 46: "Then shall he say also to them on the left hand, Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire which is prepared for the devil and his angels...." "And these shall go away into eternal punishment: but the righteous into eternal life." We were presented with an explanation of the seven Spirits of Yahweh mentioned in Revelation 5:6 by harmonizing this passage with Isaiah 11:1-3. The sermon ended with Joel 2:28 and John 7:37-38

That afternoon, we gathered for the final worship service of the Last Great Day. The moderator for the afternoon was Deacon Nathaniel Meyer, and Senior Missionary Barukyah Shaparenko brought the devotions.

The first sermon for the afternoon was a pre-recorded message

by Directing Elder Jacob O. Meyer (OBM) titled "Last Great Day." In this message, we were taught the lessons associated with the sacrifices offered on the eighth day (Numbers 29:35). Elder Meyer also reminded us that circumcision is of the heart, and that, whenever we thirst, we should go to Yahshua for drink. He closed the sermon with Revelation 22:17. "And the Spirit and the bride say, Come. And he that hears, let him say, Come. And he that is thirsty. let him come: he that will, let him take the water of life freely."

The second message with words of motivation was delivered by Teaching Elder Jonathan S. Meyer. The title was "United We Must Be." Using the examples of Israel in the time of Nehemiah (chapters 4 and 6), we were heartened to be the people with a mind to build the Assemblies of Yahweh, to be on guard for Satan and his evil devices, and to know that Yahweh will fight for us always. Elder Jonathan posed the question: "Are you ready to turn the world upside down?" (Acts 17:6). Using Isaiah 62:10-12 and Jeremiah 51:27, Elder Jonathan closed the



message with these words: "Lift up the Banner of Truth! We have a message of freedom—take it to the world!"

After these messages of spiritual upliftment, Teaching Elder Jonathan S. Meyer presented a brief financial report, then moved into the consecration and dedication of the Graduate Obadiahs, Senior Missionaries, and Missionaries. Several babies were also dedicated to Almighty Yahweh. We then had a break during which all those who require healing came forward to be anointed. This healing service was conducted by both Teaching Elder Jonathan S. Meyer and Deacon Nathaniel A. Meyer.

As the day was dying in the west, we came together for the final moments of the Feast. Teaching Elder Jonathan S. Meyer led us in some very joyful congregational songs of praise to Yahweh. It was a bittersweet moment as we blended our voices together to sing **Yah Be With You Till We Meet Again.** The Aaronic Blessing was pronounced upon us, and we shouted: On to the Kingdom!" and "Keep up that Inspiration!"
